Where do we sleep?

Once you enter the venerable building, it becomes quickly apparent that no two rooms are the same. Some have a terrace, some impressive three-metre high ceilings and some can be combined for families. There are 49 guest rooms in categories M room, M attic oom, L-room and XL-room spread over the hotel's four levels. Elements from the world of the former Harbour Master and references to the history of the listed building itself have been expertly placed by the design team, DREIMETA Armin Fischer in the form of wood panelling, brass mirrors or old wash tables. Every quarter boasts the famous 25hours standard features such as the UE Boom Bluetooth speakers or sustainable cosmetics.

The Boilerman Bar

The heart of the Altes Hafenamts used to beat in this former chartroom: A rendezvous for hotel guests and the neighbourhood, the Boilerman Bar is the perfect spot to enjoy a typical highball – a top-quality, straightforward drink served in a frozen glass. But there’s no freezing going on here though, as the dark-blue walls and wooden furniture give the bar a cosy atmosphere. The three surviving cast iron pillars with red capitals at the bar and the picture of the old Harbour Master are a striking addition. Fancy somewhere a little more private?. Head to the Blue Room or the separate lounge.
